**THE ELECTRICITY WORKS (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT)
(SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2017**

Notice is hereby given that RWE Renewables UK Onshore Wind Ltd, company registration number 03758407, having its Registered Office at Windmill Hill Business Park, Whitehill Way, Swindon, Wiltshire SN5 6PB, has applied to the Scottish Ministers for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989 to construct and operate a wind farm known as Ceislein Wind Farm, on land on the Novar Estate, approximately 3.5 km west of Alness and 8 km northeast of Dingwall, in the Scottish Highlands (Central Grid Reference X 258000 Y 870900). The installed capacity of the proposed generating station would be approximately 77 megawatts (MW) for the wind element, comprising up to 11 turbines with a maximum ground to blade tip heights of up to 200 m and up to 250 m, and approximately 65 MW for the battery energy storage system. The proposed development is subject to Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), and an EIA Report has been produced.

The Company has also requested a direction under section 57(2) of the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997 that planning permission for the development be deemed to be granted.

A copy of the application, with a plan showing the land to which it relates, together with a copy of the EIA Report discussing the Company's proposals in more detail and presenting an analysis of the environmental implications, are available for public inspection in person, free of charge, during normal office hours at:

All representations should be received not later than Friday 8th May 2026. Scottish Ministers may be able to consider written representations received after this date.

Any subsequent additional information which is submitted by the Company will be subject to further public notice in this manner, and representations to such information will be accepted as per this notice.

Where Scottish Ministers decide to exercise their discretion to do so, they can cause a public inquiry to be held.

Scottish Ministers will determine the application for consent in one of two ways:

- Grant consent, with or without conditions attached; or
- Refuse the proposal.
