







A £25,000 grant from the Gwynt y Môr Wind Farm Community Fund is helping to transform the pitch at Meliden Football Club.

The funding is supporting a full pitch renovation and installation of a new drainage system, creating a stateof-the-art facility that will enhance sporting experiences and increase participation across the community. The project involves removing the existing pitch and outdated drainage system, followed by the installation of a modern, highperformance drainage solution.

The area will then be backfilled with subsoil, topped with fresh topsoil, and reseeded to create an excellent new playing surface. The club will also receive new maintenance equipment to ensure the pitch remains in top condition throughout the year.





Serving some of North Wales's most disadvantaged communities, 1Compass is committed to helping young people build resilience and brighter futures through tailored support, skills development, and guidance.

A grant of over £24,000 from the Gwynt y Môr Wind Farm Community Fund has enabled the organisation to recruit an additional youth worker.

This allows 1 Compass to run regular, year-round sessions for its three core youth groups, focusing on confidence, communication, positive

social skills, family relationships, school attendance, and reducing anti-social behaviour.

The extra capacity also means the charity can expand its one-to-one home visit programme, supporting more young people not in education, training or employment.

This helps bridge the gap between isolated home environments and youth group participation—creating a more connected and supported journey, led by professional youth workers.
