
Home-Start Flintshire has received a 2 year funding commitment from Gwynt y Môr Offshore Wind Farm Community Fund. This means they can provide much needed support for even more families in rural North Wales.

The funding has made it possible to employ a part-time project co-ordinator, who has worked closely with local schools to launch three new groups in the area. Baby Massage, Stay & Play, and Play & Learn sessions now give parents and children the chance to come together, build connections, and access early learning support where opportunities were once scarce.

For parents, these groups reduce feelings of isolation and provide a welcoming space to share experiences.

For children, the Play and Learn sessions are helping them develop the confidence and skills to start school ready to thrive.

This investment is already making a big difference by strengthening families, supporting early development, and creating stronger communities across Flintshire.


A three-year funding package from the Clocaenog Onshore Wind Farm Fund has helped secure the future of South Denbighshire Community Partnership (SDCP) - a true lifeline for people living across the rural Ederynion area.

From its welcoming base at Canolfan Ni in Corwen, the Pengwern Hub in Llangollen, and smaller centres in local churches, SDCP reaches into the heart of the community, supporting people of all ages. The funding has safeguarded essential services such as Meals on Wheels, community transport, prescription deliveries, shopping trips, and the much-loved Luncheon Clubs.

For many older residents, these are not just practical services but vital moments of connection, friendship, and care.

The grant has also allowed SDCP to continue offering opportunities that bring people together and respond directly to local needs. From hosting parent and toddler groups and craft activities to providing financial advice, mental health support, food growing, and exercise classes.

By creating trusted spaces where people feel welcomed and valued, the partnership is reducing isolation, improving health and wellbeing whilst strengthening community spirit across rural Denbighshire.


