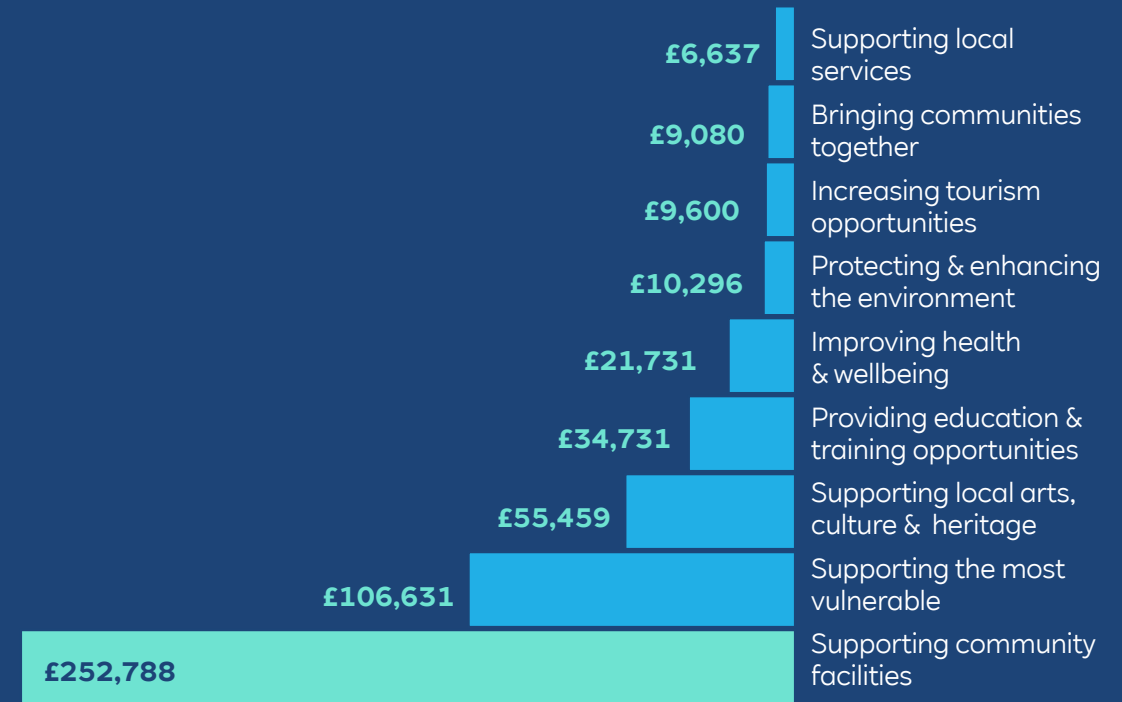

# Llew Gwyn Cerrigydrudion

Proposed new kitchen and renovation of dining rooms



Investing in communities, creating jobs & new opportunities

**The Llew Gwyn, the only pub in Cerrigydrudion, was saved by a group of 60 locals who banded together and invested their own money to bring it back from the brink.**

Having transformed the bar area last year, as well as fixing the roof and fitting solar panels, the pub has been able to hold sheep shearing competitions and host birthday parties, but it hasn't yet been able to provide its own food.

Now, having been awarded a £69,960 business grant by the Clocaenog Forest Wind Farm Fund and after raising other money, they are being able to realise their plans for a new kitchen so they will be able to serve food, offer a function room and even guest bedrooms.

# Hastings Advice and Representation Centre



**Hastings Advice and Representation Centre (HARC) provides specialist welfare benefit advice and representation to people of all ages in East Sussex.**

£5,000 from Little Cheyne Court Wind Farm funded a part time specialist welfare benefits advisor and trainer for 6 months to deliver specialist welfare benefit advice and representation services.

This funding has helped HARC to reach some particularly isolated areas of rural Rother, relieving poverty, addressing inequality, improving wellbeing and fighting injustice.
